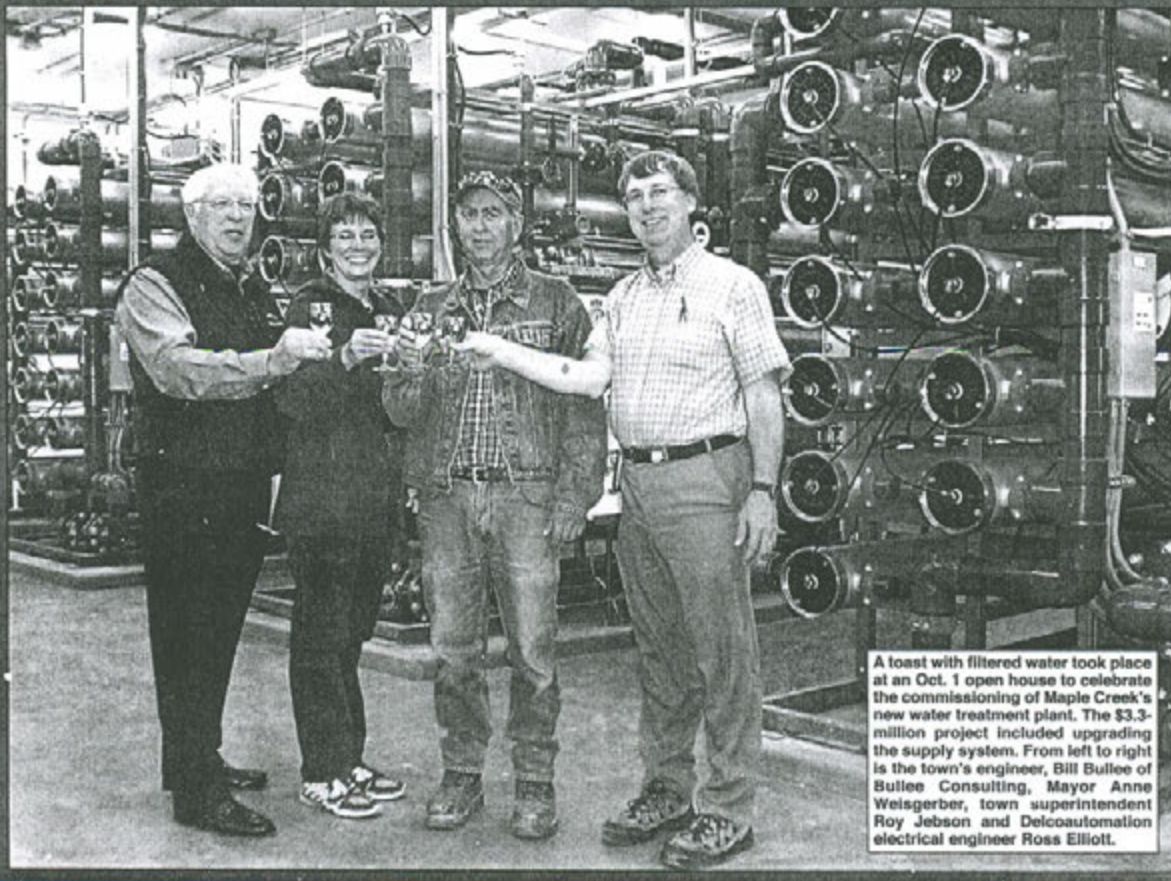


# Town Water Project Completed

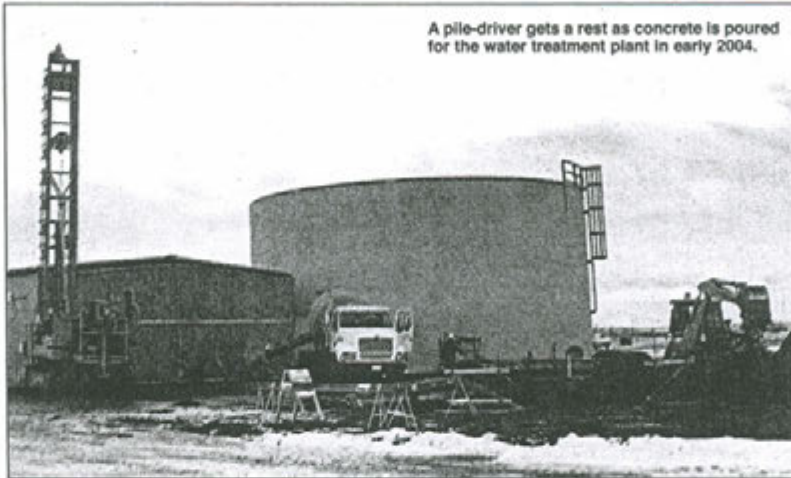

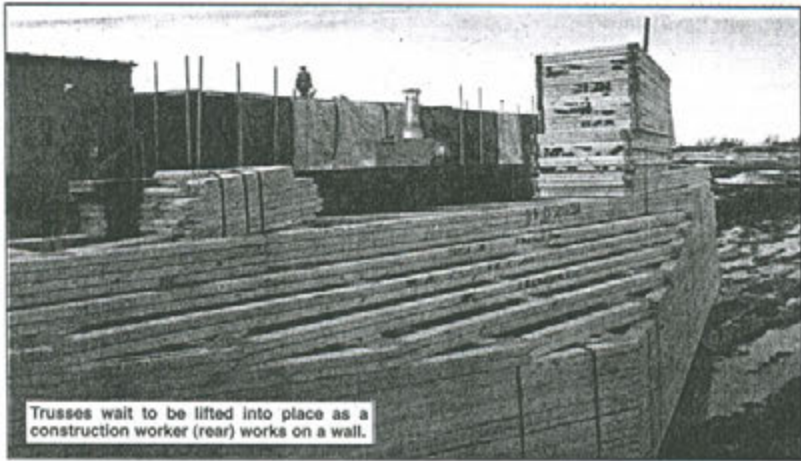

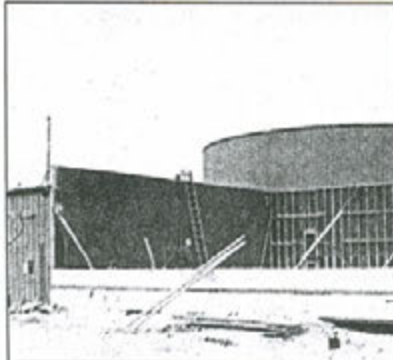

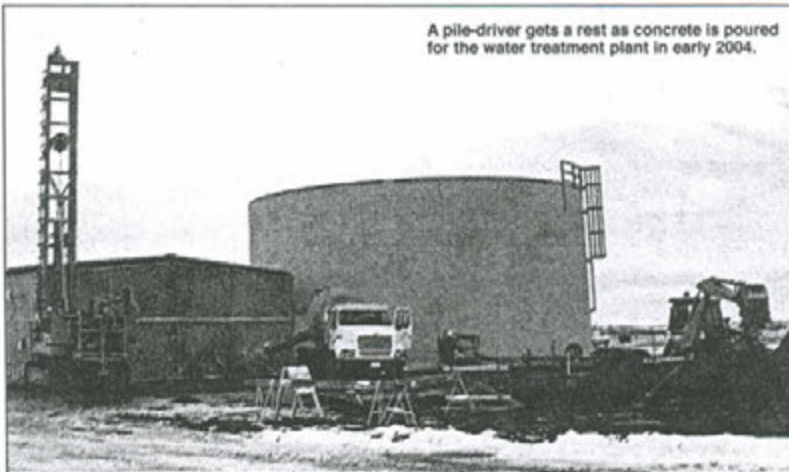

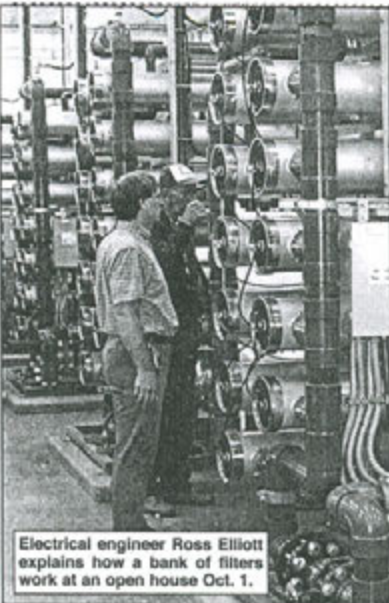

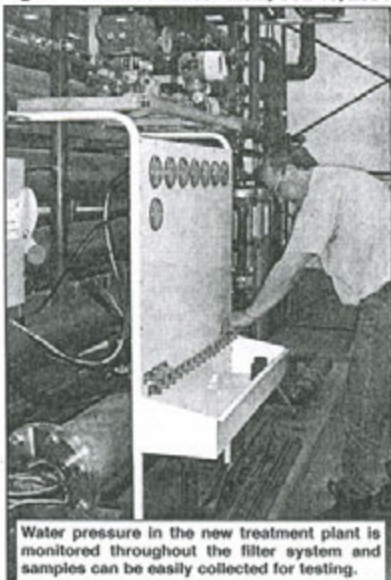




Electrical engineer Ross Elliott explains how a bank of filters work at an open house Oct. 1.
